Funding to Fight Homelessness

There is a severe human and fiscal cost of homelessness. In response, there's a new infusion of funding in California--approximately \$750 million in three new programs--to help local governments address the needs of California's homeless population.

These programs include:



Homeless Emergency Aid Program

(HEAP) \$500 million

No Place Like Home (NPLH) Program

California Emergency Solutions and Housing (CESH) Program

\$53 million

Before, During and After California Wildland Fires: The New Normal

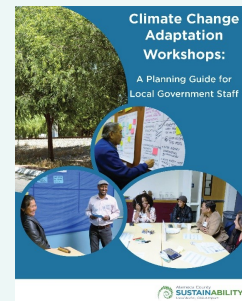
