The Beacon Program is funded by California utility ratepayers and administered by Pacific Gas and Electric Company, San Diego Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison and Southern California Gas Company under the auspices of the California Public Utilities Commission.



Energy Efficiency and Conservation Activities

Silver

1. East Palo Alto city staff works with Stanford University students to evaluate risks, challenges, and benefits for a variety of energy, water, and other sustainability initiatives.

Gold

2. In 2016, the City of East Palo Alto joined Peninsula Clean Energy to help give residents and businesses access to cleaner energy at lower rates.

Water & Wastewater Systems Activities

Silver

1. The City of East Palo Alto worked closely with the City of Palo Alto to secure some of its water shares (approximately 500,000 gallons of water per day) to ensure a quality water supply for its residents.

2. The city recently rehabilitated the Gloria Well, a critical component in the city's goal of developing its own water management system.

Green Building Activities

Silver

1. The city recently secured a \$20 million Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities (AHSC) grant to renovate and expand a housing project that includes energy efficient building, electric bus service, new sidewalks and bikeways, and other sustainability features.

Gold

2. In 2007, the City of East Palo Alto celebrated its first Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certified building. The city's 32,000 square foot YMCA building uses 30% less energy than state standards require and incorporates sustainable building materials, low volatile organic compound coatings, and water conservation measures.

Waste Reduction and Recycling Activities

Silver

1. In the fall of 2017, the city added 1.5 staff positions to work on waste reduction initiatives.

Gold

2. In 2019, East Palo Alto is hosting its first annual citywide “little pickup” in which 15 volunteers helped remove 5,700 gallons of litter.
3. In 2019, the city will have completed its retrofit project to install a trash capture device at the O’Connor Street Pump Station.

Climate-friendly Purchasing Activities

Silver

1. The City of East Palo Alto purchases paper products that contain post-consumer recycled content.

Renewable Energy and Low-Carbon Fuels Activities

Silver

1. The City of East Palo Alto is partnering with GRID Alternatives to offer rooftop solar energy systems to low-income residents at no cost.

Efficient Transportation Activities

Silver

1. The city completed construction of a new pedestrian bridge over Highway 101 at University Avenue, which now connects the west side of town to the city's major shopping area.

2. In 2017, the city council adopted a Bicycle Master Plan.

Land Use and Community Design Activities

Silver

1. The city partnered with a local non-profit organization to create a first-of-its-kind Safe Parking Program for residents living in recreational vehicles (RVs). The program offers designated spaces for up to 20 local RV dwellers to park overnight, gain access to portable showers, laundry services, and other social services designed for persons without permanent housing.

Gold

2. The city adopted an Affordable Housing Strategy in October 2018, which sets the goal of facilitating 500 new affordable housing apartments within the next five years.
3. With funding from the Strategic Growth Council, the City of East Palo Alto updated its General Plan in 2016, which includes strategies to increase housing units by 30%.

Open Space and Offsetting Carbon Emission Activities

Silver

1. The city permitted an electric vehicle charging station at the city's major retail center.

Gold

2. The city adopted its Climate Action Plan in 2011.
3. Due to the city's lack of public parks, East Palo Alto adopted a Park-in-Lieu Ordinance, which requires housing developers of more than five units to either provide a park or pay an in-lieu fee that the city can use to support additional parks and open space.

Promoting Community and Individual Action Activities

Silver

1. Due to the huge interest in development within city limits, the City of East Palo Alto has implemented a pre-application process that all developers must go through before engaging in community meetings and before the official process and any land use decisions begin.

2. The city hosts water-saving tips on its website.
