
Webinar Overview



Regional Role in Housing: RHNA



- Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA)
 State housing law requirement to determine existing and projected housing needs
- 8-year planning period
- SCAG cycles:

• 5th cycle: 2013-2021

• 6th cycle: 2021-2029

• SCAG 6th cycle Housing Elements due October 2021




Regional Role in Housing: RHNA



Housing need for 2021-2029

SCAG regional housing need: 1,341,827




- RHNA is the quantification of housing need for the planning period
- Housing elements are prepared by the jurisdiction to accommodate the RHNA allocation through sites analysis, zoning, and other programs

Housing Supply Has Not Kept Up with Need


